## Training of Trainers (TOT) Neonatal Resuscitation Program



As of 2024, the neonatal mortality rate (NMR) in India stands at approximately 18.1 deaths per 1,000 live births. This figure reflects ongoing efforts to reduce infant mortality, though challenges remain, particularly in rural areas and among economically disadvantaged populations. Neonatal resuscitation when implemented systematically by trained personnel can reduce significant number of neonatal deaths, so it is imperative to train health care personals. The Neonatal Resuscitation Program (NRP) Training of Trainers (TOT) Basic Instructor Course is designed to equip healthcare professionals with the knowledge and skills necessary to effectively teach neonatal resuscitation techniques. The course emphasizes the importance of rapid, accurate assessment and intervention in neonatal emergencies to improve outcomes for newborns.

- Advanced NRP instructor courses.
- Specialized training sessions focusing on high-risk neonatal populations.

The course effectively equipped healthcare professionals with the necessary skills and knowledge to train others in neonatal resuscitation. The positive feedback from participants highlighted the importance of such training in enhancing







#### 1. Introduction

#### 2. Course Objectives

The primary objectives of the NRP Basic Provider Course were to:

- Improve participants' ability to identify newborns requiring resuscitation.
- Equip learners with skills to stabilize and manage newborns in distress.
- Strengthen communication and teamwork during neonatal emergencies.
- Promote adherence to the latest evidence-based neonatal resuscitation guidelines.

#### 3. Course Structure

The course was divided into two components: an online theoretical module and an inperson practical session.

Online Theoretical Module: Prior to attending the practical workshop, participants were required to complete an online self-paced learning module covering the key concepts of neonatal resuscitation, including preparation, initial steps of care, positive pressure ventilation (PPV), chest compression s, and medications.

**In-Person Practical Session:** On 22nd September, the in-person practical component took place at [Insert Venue Name]. The session focused on hands-on training, where participants practiced various resuscitation techniques on neonatal simulators. Scenarios included newborns with respiratory distress, cardiac arrest, and compromised vital signs. Skills such as bag-mask ventilation, and chest compression s were emphasized.

**Team Dynamics and Leadership:** Participants practiced in multidisciplinary teams, mimicking real-life neonatal resuscitation teams. This emphasized the importance of effective communication, role clarity, and leadership during critical neonatal situations.

**Adherence to Updated Guidelines:-**The course followed the 2024 NRP guidelines, which included updates on ventilation strategies and timing of interventions. The training ensured that participants were familiar with the latest evidence-based practices.

#### 5. Participant Feedback-

The feedback from the participants was overwhelmingly positive. Most of the attendees appreciated the blend of theory and practical skills, especially the hands-on experience with simulators. Key takeaways included the enhanced confidence in performing neonatal resuscitation and a better understanding of the team-based approach during emergencies.

However, a few participants suggested extending the time allocated for the practical sessions to allow more opportunities for skill repetition, especially for complex procedures like intubation.

#### 6. Conclusion

The NRP Basic Provider Course on 22nd September 2024 was a resounding success, effectively meeting its objective of enhancing participants' neonatal resuscitation skills. The combination of theoretical knowledge, simulation-based practice, and teamwork exercises prepared healthcare professionals to manage neonatal emergencies more effectively. This course continues to be a crucial step in improving neonatal outcomes by ensuring that healthcare providers are well-trained in life-saving techniques.

#### 7. Recommendations

- Extend practical session duration to allow for more in-depth practice of complex procedures. Incorporate additional case-based discussions for various neonatal complications to further enhance critical thinking. It is recommended that participants undergo periodic refresher courses and advanced neonatal resuscitation training to maintain proficiency and stay updated on any future changes to the guidelines.

Additionally, integrating NRP training into continuous professional development (CPD) programs could ensure sustained competency in neonatal care.
